City Engineer Watts reported that right-of-way acquisition of properties for the roundabout project at Alta and Nebraska Avenues have been acquired with the exception of property located at 148 East Nebraska Avenue which is a residential property.

Watts explained that several attempts to contact the property owner of record to negotiate the proper acquisition price for the property. The property owner was duly notified of this hearing in English and Spanish as required by law. The Council is now being asked to consider a resolution of necessity to acquire the property in question through eminent domain.

Council Member Morales asked if the owner will be compensated and Watts said yes the property was appraised and they will receive the fair market value of \$41,400.

Council Member Reynosa asked how the absent owner will be paid. Watts replied that the court will decide.

Council Member Longoria asked if the problem was in not finding the owner. Watts said there was confusion on how the title was transferred between the owners.

City Manager Patlan said through eminent domain the city is able to obtain the property without a clouded title.

Mayor said this is a unique situation and we are having public hearings and asked if we are complying with all rules that apply.

Attorney Jenner said we are complying with all of the laws that are applicable at this time.

No comments concerning the hearing were received. Watts requested that the Council adopt Resolution No. 2020-19 as presented.

A motion was made by Vice Mayor Longoria, second by Council Member Launer, to adopt Resolution No. 2020-19 authorizing the commencement of eminent domain actions to acquire portions of APN 014-071-001, also known as 148 East Nebraska Avenue, Dinuba, CA 93618, consisting of a residence.

Mayor Thusu shared that Dinuba Healthcare nursing home has quarantined staff due to a Covid infection on site and they are in need of food. He expressed that we need a plan going forward.

Council Member Reynosa asked if the donation is for the facility or for the affected staff. Mayor Thusu said it is for the staff and food and PPE are what is needed.

8. MAYOR/COUNCIL REPORTS

The Council expressed to everyone listening to stay safe and stay home as much as possible. They also expressed congratulations for Sam Hara recently promoted to evidence technician.

9. CITY MANAGER COMMUNICATIONS

City Manager Patlan Sam Hara congratulations. He thanked the executive team for remaining calm and steady-handed during this time and added that as long as we continue to do so we will get through this.

10. CITY STAFF COMMUNICATIONS

Chief Popovich thanked the Council for recognizing Hara's efforts. His promotion is effective on May 4. As a result of his promotion we now have two open recruitments for animal control officers.

Chief Popovich reported that the 9-1-1 system funded by the state was completed within the past two weeks.

RECOMMENDATION

Council review and accept the financial report for quarter ending March 31, 2020 for fiscal year 2019-20.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The following report summarizes the City's revenue and expenditure activity for the fiscal year through March 31, 2020. The City Charter requires a quarterly report comparing budgeted revenues and expenditures to actual amounts. This report meets the charter requirements.

OUTSTANDING ISSUES

None.

DISCUSSION

GENERAL FUND

GENERAL FUND REVENUES (Attachment 'A').

March 31, 2020 is 75% of the fiscal year 2020. The General Fund revenues received were at 67% of the annual budget estimates. Key revenues receipts appear to be on target with the revenue estimates.

SALES TAX – The sales tax revenues represent the largest funding source in the general fund. At 64% actual revenues collected in the third quarter, revenues are on target through the third quarter.

OVERHEAD/INTERNAL SERVICE - The internal services charges are allocated to the appropriate funds on a monthly basis.

MOTOR VEHICLE IN LIEU - The motor vehicle in lieu revenues are property tax shares allocated to cities and counties that began in fiscal year 2004-2005 as compensation of Vehicle License Fee previous allocated to cities and counties by the state. Total received is 51% of the annual estimate.

UTILITY USERS TAX – Utility user's tax is paid to the city one month in arrears, at third quarter the amount received is \$1,012,355, 74% of the estimate. Amounts vary because usage varies from one season (hot summer) to the next (mild fall) and the next (cold winter).

PROPERTY TAX - A major portion of property tax revenue was distributed to the City in December. The City received \$668,772, 60% of the estimate. The next major distribution will occur in June.

BUSINESS LICENSE TAX – The City receives a large portion of business license at the beginning of each fiscal year; the current revenues are at 114%. The revenues will routinely appear high through the third quarter of every year.

FRANCHISE TAX – The Franchise Tax is reflecting a low percentage of 22% of revenues due to not receiving the majority of revenues until April, which are P G & E and Gas franchise tax.

PERMITS/FINES/SERVICE FEES – Charges for services are on target at 88% for the quarter. Recreational activities and permits make up a large portion of these estimated revenues.

OTHER – Revenues from other sources are currently at 98% and are anticipated to meet budgeted expectations. These revenues are from intergovernmental grants, reimbursements, and miscellaneous.

GENERAL FUND EXPENSES (Attachment 'A').

The City has expended roughly 74% of its appropriations as of March 31, 2020.

REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES-ALL FUNDS (Attachment 'B').

ENTERPRISE FUNDS

UTILITY FUNDS

Through March expenses exceed revenues in the Water fund. In Disposal and Sewer funds expenses slightly exceeded revenues. While revenues were at 68% or less through March for the utility funds, expenses were slightly higher. At the end of this quarter the water and sewer revenues only reflect seven month's worth of revenues; however at the end of the year the two months will be accrued.

TRANSIT

Through March expenses are on target at 52% of projected budget. The majority of these revenue grant funds are from Fresno County, the State of California, and federal government, which we have not yet received, reflecting revenues 11% and are not disbursed on a consistent basis, therefore, may lag through the fiscal year.

AMBULANCE

Through the third quarter expenses are in line with projections. After the budget was adopted The City was able to secure additional funding through the Intergovernmental Transfer (IGT) program through the California Health Care Services Department. Currently at third quarter the revenues are at 33% of budget. Expenses are on target at 73%.

GOLF

Current revenues and expenditures in the Golf Course are on target, reflecting revenues at 55% and expenses are on target at 54%.

INTERNAL SERVICE FUNDS

INSURANCE

For the third quarter the revenues are on target at 70% of the budgeted amounts. The expenses are reflecting a 90% one-time payments made through the third quarter.

SPECIAL REVENUES

TRANSPORTATION

The fund is a 45% in revenue is reflecting expenses made not yet been reimbursed. In the third quarter expenses are on target at 48%.

PUBLIC SAFETY SALES TAX

Current revenues and expenditures in the Public Safety Fund are on target. The revenues reflect a 53% through the third quarter. The expenses are on target at 65%.

COPS AND POST TRAINING

Revenues for these funds are at 156%. The expenses will be reimbursed once incurred. The expenses which are at 79% will be adjusted at year end.

SUCCESSOR AGENCY

The payments for the RDA debt service were made in the first and second quarter, making the expense 72%.

CAPITAL FUNDS

TRANSPORTATION CONSTRUCTION

Through March expenses exceeded revenues; however, the expense must be made in order to receive reimbursement.

DEBT SERVICE FUNDS

The long-term debt funds of Water, Sewer and the Financing Authority are all showing expenses lower than 273% through the third quarter of the year. This is due to a one-time entry to the sewer bond for the refinancing of the 2007 Wastewater bond. These payments are made semiannually and thus skew the third quarter picture. Additionally, principal payments are paid in the fall and not in the spring.

FISCAL IMPACT

Revenues and expenditures for all fund types are on target for the third quarter.

General Plan Amendment/Zone Change Application No. 2020-01 (Amed) (IH)

RECOMMENDATION

Council conduct a hearing to receive testimony concerning Application No. 2020-01, close the hearing and take the following action by one motion:

1. Adopt Resolution No. 2020-18 amending the General Plan Land Use Map from "Public-Semi-Public" to "Commercial Neighborhood."
2. Introduce and conduct the first reading, waive reading in full, of the Ordinance No. 2020-02 amending the City of Dinuba Zoning Map from "Resource Conservation" (RCO) to "Neighborhood Commercial" (C-1).

Consultant Schoettler reported that both parcels are currently zoned RCO. He noted that with the approval of the new high school location at Kamm and Alta, the district is no longer interested in designating the parcel RCO. Schoettler reported that the Planning Commission voted on March 3, 2020 and approved the zone change.

Council Member Launer shared her concerns of bypassing the CEQA process. She shared that we need to be able to take care of CEQA requirements. She asked if there will be a restriction on the type of business after its approved. She shared concern with the proximity of the school because there is an alcohol permit at the current location. She stated she has issues with changing the designation.

Schoettler said staff discussed the CEQA concerns. It would only allow what is currently there bringing it up to code and reducing impacts such as water and energy uses. Parking was also discussed and staff thought it would be less of an impact in terms of an environmental review. The city standard of cars is 100 per hour and a small store like this would have much less traffic. We could do a CEQA report but we are not sure what else CEQA would review.

Council Member Launer said we know during school hours there are well more than 100 cars going there. Another concern she expressed is the prior existence of underground tanks to the south. She stated we should follow the guidance of CEQA.

Schoettler acknowledged her concerns.

Public Works Director Hernandez concurred with the remarks made by Schoettler. He stated staff will talk to the owner to make sure it remains a neighborhood market and parking and traffic will be remedied. If council directs

that the CEQA process is necessary, staff will surely do that. He reiterated that it would not change the impacts by the market.

City Manager Patlan said the store's change in zoning is an attempt to conform with the zoned use. One thing to consider when a building is non-conforming, as this one has been for many many years, is that this is an opportunity to improve the building and the site. The onus is pretty high for the type of use and property. It's a good time to improve upon the services he's providing to the neighborhood. Staff is right in recommending the rezoning of the property. The council could issue a condition upon review and approval of the site plan.

The Mayor opened the hearing and no comments were submitted for the hearing of the item. The Mayor closed the hearing.

A motion was made by Council Member Morales, second by Vice Mayor Longoria, to adopt Resolution No.2020-18 amending the General Plan Land Use Map from Public-Semi-Public to Commercial Neighborhood; and, to introduce and conduct the first reading, waive reading in full, of the Ordinance No. 2020-02 amending the City of Dinuba Zoning Map from Resource Conservation to Neighborhood Commercial (C-1).

7. DEPARTMENT REPORTS

7.1. SUBJECT

COVID-19 Update

RECOMMENDATION

Council to receive informational update regarding Covid-19 pandemic and provide direction to staff as necessary.

City Manager Patlan thanked the Council for their patience during this current situation. He reported Governor Newsom and governors of Washington and Oregon are working on ways to eventually reopen the economy.

He reported the current COVID-19 stats:

- 296 confirmed cases
- no new related deaths reported today
- 15 full recoveries reported

He reported the County's situation report shows 30 cases now with a slight uptick in cases.

He reported that staff is doing an outstanding job providing services to residents. Chiefs Thompson and Popovich have been making sure their staff has the proper gear when responding to calls. He thanked Assistant City Manager James for updating of the COVID-19 on the City website. Finance staff has been closely watching the economy. Residents have been taking the pandemic seriously. Staff has worked really well to make sure staff and the public is protected when dealing with the COVID-19. Stimulus payments are going out. The biggest unknown is the date the president and governors will open up the economy hopefully not too

soon so we don't see a resurgence of this pandemic.

Council Member Morales asked about the revenue loss on car dealerships. Patlan said we won't know until the end of July or August. We do know that sales have slowed across the country. Online car sales have been doing very well.

Assistant City Manager James referred to a close contact who works for Best Buy and they have been doing very well with online sales.

City Manager Patlan said as long as the large employers in our city don't have COVID-19 exposures, they should continue to do very well.

Mayor Thusu asked if staff knows how soon we will have access to testing. Fire Chief Thompson said we don't have information yet. He explained the county will only report how many positive cases there are in each jurisdiction. He also recommended that staff looks at our budgets to make sure our city is in tact physically and financially.

Council Member Morales shared that he was asked by an individual if COVID-19 is real because she did not believe it is real. He asked if staff could send out information about COVID-19 via flyers or the City's phone alert system.

Assistant City Manager James reported that a message is sent out via telephone in English and Spanish as well as on the website that is translated in several languages. We could consider other options such as a flyer included with utility bills.

8. MAYOR/COUNCIL REPORTS

Council Member Reynosa thanked staff for all their work during this time.

Council Member Launer thanked staff as well; she said we do need more robocalls to go out.

Mayor Thusu said he saw a social media post about Magnolia Market from Reedley Fire. Chief Thompson said many times mutual aid is routinely requested on certain types of fires and Reedley was there at the fire along with Visalia Fire.

9. CITY MANAGER COMMUNICATIONS

City Manager Patlan reported that residential construction will continue as long as we can continue to inspect the buildings. The United Health Center is expected to be completed in about 30 days. Dr. Narayan is continuing to move forward on his project. City Manager Patlan thanked Council for their patience and understanding during this difficult time.

10. CITY STAFF COMMUNICATIONS

Assistant City Manager James reported that the Cinco de Mayo festival is cancelled this year.

Chief Thompson thanked the executive team and said communication has been great. He especially thanked his fire staff for the great work they are doing. His department received 55 gallons of hand sanitizer earlier in the day and distributed some to staff in

other departments and will continue to do so as needed.

Chief Popovich said his staff is also doing very well. The department purchased disinfectant appliances in order to disinfect police vehicles and other equipment. He reported that two others will be received and will be shared with the other city departments.

11. CLOSED SESSION

11.1. Conference with Legal Counsel - Anticipated Litigation (MM)

Anticipated litigation pursuant to GC Section 54956.9: One (1) case.

The Council voted 5-0 and gave direction to initiate litigation in one matter. Once the matter is formally commenced, particulars may be disclosed upon inquiry by any person unless it is determined that to do so will jeopardize the City's ability to effectuate service of process.

12. ADJOURNMENT

Mayor Thusu adjourned the meeting at 7:42 pm.

Subject: Annual Agreement Between the City of Dinuba and the Dinuba Unified School District for the School Resource Officer for FY 2020-21 (DP)

RECOMMENDATION

Council to approve the School Resource Officer (SRO) Agreement with the Dinuba Unified School District for the 2020-21 school year and authorize the City Manager or designee to execute the agreement.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City of Dinuba and the Dinuba Unified School District have been in partnership under a formal School Resource Officer (SRO) agreement since 1999. This agreement provides for two (2) School Resource Officers. One officer is assigned to the Dinuba High School campus on a shared basis with the Sierra Vista campus, and one officer is assigned to the Washington Intermediate School campus on a shared basis with JFK academy. The SRO program provides for police presence on campus and police services in the areas of crime prevention intervention/enforcement, teaching and counseling.

OUTSTANDING ISSUES

None.

DISCUSSION

The School Resource Officer (SRO) partnership with the school district has improved the on-campus environment for safety, behavior, attendance, and grades of students. The school district is supportive in continuing this agreement with the City. Minor adjustments have been made in the financial sections of the agreement to reflect the increase in salary and benefits of the officers.

The agreement specifies that the City and the District agree to share in the costs, salary, benefits, vehicle maintenance, training, and estimated overtime of the two (2) SRO officers with each entity paying 50% of these expenditures. The cost for the 2020-21 school year will be \$175,180 per assigned officer for the one-year period of this agreement totaling \$350,360. The school district agrees to reimburse the City, billed on a quarterly basis over the 2020-21 school year for a total of \$175,180.

A copy of the SRO agreement is enclosed herein as Attachment 'A'.

FISCAL IMPACT

The annual cost of the SRO program is \$350,360 for two (2) officers assigned to the school district. The total cost of the program is split 50/50 between the City and the Dinuba Unified School District. The District agrees to reimburse the City \$175,180 for the SRO program.

Campus Based Peace Officer (CBPO) City/School Agreement

This agreement is entered into, and recognized as a vital working partnership agreement (Based on the City/School JPA), between the City of Dinuba referred to as the CITY, and the Dinuba Unified School District, referred to as the DISTRICT.

The City and District desire to place one School Resource Officer (SRO) on the campus of the Dinuba High School and one School Resource Officer on the campus of the Washington Intermediate School and Sierra Vista School. This represents a total of two SRO's assigned to the District for the purpose of providing police presence and police services in the areas of prevention, intervention/enforcement, training and counseling.

It is the intent of the City and District that the establishment of the SRO partnership will improve the safety, behavior, attendance and grades of the students on the campuses as measured by a decrease in suspensions, student expulsions, illegal offenses and juvenile crime.

The City and District are willing to enter into this agreement upon the terms and conditions set forth:

1. The City shall provide to the District:
 - a. Two SRO's, one assigned to the campus of Dinuba High School on a shared basis with Sierra Vista campus and one assigned to the Washington Intermediate School campus.
 - b. All SRO's will be scheduled to be at the schools of their respective assignment during the hours and times recommended by the schools' principal and mutually

agreed upon by the City and District. Generally, this will be between 7:30 AM and 4:30 PM Monday through Friday with considerations given for flexible scheduling on days with school events such as games and dances.

- c. Generally speaking, the SRO's will be available for a 40-hour workweek beginning the 2nd week of August through the 4th week of May. Vacations and time off will track as practical with the District's vacation and time off schedules.
- d. All SRO's are Peace Officers under the Penal Code and are employed by the Dinuba Police Department answerable directly and solely to the Chief of Police or the Chief's designee.

2. The District shall provide to support this program the following:

- a. The Principal of each site shall designate a site administrator as the liaison and District operational coordinator to the SRO and will provide a system of accountability by which the SRO can follow which is conducive to the normal operations of the District and City.
- b. Each school site shall provide adequate office space on-site; along with a desk, telephone, school site radio, and office supplies.
- c. Provide up to \$2000 annually for training for POST certified and assignment related classes to further develop the skills and abilities of the SRO's. Such training and classes will support a planned developmental program mutually developed by the District and City. (Please see Attachment B for available courses to attend as needed.)
- d. Designated parking spots will be available at each site for the SRO official vehicle.

3. School Resource Officers shall provide the following to the campus of their respective assignments:

- a. The SRO attire will be the police service uniform with modifications authorized to include a police standard polo shirt and jacket.
- b. Each SRO will be assigned a patrol vehicle appropriately marked and identified as a police vehicle as a part of this program.
- c. SRO will work on their assigned campus as their primary workstation throughout the school year in a collaborative manner with the site administrators and staff, maintaining the highest level of visibility possible. It will be the intent of this agreement, for the SRO's not to be called away from their assigned school work site for any form of routine police business. SRO's may be called to leave their work site only for incidents of catastrophic scale jeopardizing citywide security after proper notification to the site administrator.
- d. SRO's will develop and maintain open communications and accountability with the administration of their assigned campus and foster and maintain that accountability with the management of the school so the District is always aware of the officer's status on and off campus.
- e. SRO's will make a positive effort to interact with students as a representative of the Dinuba Police Department and as an adult role model outside the classroom, on the school grounds or during any school activity.
- f. SRO's will utilize intervention, prevention teaching, counseling, and enforcement skills with all the students with special attention to those involved in criminal activity.

- g. SRO's will conduct investigations of criminal/juvenile related cases where either the victim, witness or suspect attends the school whether the case is on site or assigned as a follow up investigation.
- h. SRO's shall make every effort to see that school employees understand the instructional, intervention, or enforcement role of the SRO and how to best utilize the services provided by the Police Department.
- i. SRO's will work in a coordinating role with District staff to plan and implement monthly meetings to strategically plan and target assistance on issues regarding critical information involving criminal activity related to the schools. These meetings shall involve appropriate City and District staff, representatives of the District Attorney's Office, Tulare County Sheriff's Department, Tulare County Gang Task Force, Probation, and other agencies as needed.
- j. SRO's will attend school expulsion hearings and other administrative meetings as requested by assigned school or district administration.

4. Financial Agreement:

- a. Fiscal Breakdown in Partnership Agreement.
 - 1. The District and the City hereby agree to share in the costs, salary, benefits, vehicle maintenance, training, and estimated overtime, of the two SRO's (All at the same pay level of a Police Officer) by each paying 50% of these expenditures. Each party shall pay an estimated \$175,180 for the annual period of this agreement (See attachment A).
 - 2. The City of Dinuba will bill the District at the end of each quarter for one-fourth of \$175,180. The District shall pay that invoice within 30 days to the City of Dinuba. (Prorated for the first year of implementation.)

5. Indemnity:

- a. The District shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers from and against any and all liability, claims, damage, cost, expenses, awards, fines, judgements, and expenses of litigation (including, without limitation, costs, attorney fees, expert witness fees and prevailing party fees and cost) of every nature arising out of or in connection with the assigned officer's performance of work or his or her failure to comply with any of its obligations contained in the Agreement, except such loss or damage which was caused by the active negligence by the City or the gross or willful misconduct of the assigned officer.

The City shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the District, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers from and against any and all liability, claims, damage, cost, expenses, awards, fines, judgements, and expenses of litigation (including without limitation, costs, attorney fees, expert witness fees and prevailing party fees and cost) of every nature arising out of the active negligence by the City or the gross or willful misconduct of the assigned officer during the performance of work hereunder.

- b. If the District rejects a tender of defense by the City and/or the assigned officer under this Agreement, and it is later determined that the City and/or the officer breached no duty of care and/or was immune from liability, the District shall reimburse the City and/or officer for any and all litigation expenses (including, without limitation, costs, attorney fees, expert witness fees and prevailing party fees and cost). A duty of care or immunity determination may be made by a jury or a court, including a declaratory relief determination by a court after the City

and/or officer settles a liability claim, with or without participation by the District.

- c. The Parties acknowledge that it is not the intent of the Agreement to create a duty of care by the City or its assigned officer that they would not owe in the absence of the Agreement. The Agreement does not create an affirmative duty of care (including, without limitation, a duty to protect, a duty to deter and/or a duty to intervene) by the City or the assigned officer and the absence of the assigned officer and/or the patrol vehicle is not a material breach of this Agreement. The Parties further acknowledge that by entering into this Agreement neither the City nor its assigned officer intends to waive any immunities to which they would be entitled in the absence of the Agreement.

INTEGRATION OF PRIOR TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- d. This Agreement, including all recitals, constitutes the entire agreement of the Parties. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by the mutual written agreement of the Parties. This Agreement is invalid unless approved by the legislative body of each Party, although it may be executed by an authorized agent of each Party. An authorized agent of the City shall be a person specifically authorized by the legislative body of the City to execute this Agreement, at the level of City Manager or City Attorney or equivalent.

6. Miscellaneous items:

- a. This agreement shall commence on August 10, 2020 and continue in full force through June 30, 2021, and must be renewed annually.
- b. One SRO will be assigned to provide coverage during the summer school session at Dinuba High School as mutually agreed upon by the City and District. Generally, this will be between 7:00 AM and 2:30 PM Monday through Friday.

- c. This agreement may be terminated at any time by either party upon 120 days prior written notice to the other party.

RECOMMENDATION

Council approve the Fourth Amendment with the Tulare County Probation Department for the Non-Custody Intake Program for fiscal year 2020-21 and authorize the Chief of Police or designee to execute the agreement.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Dinuba Police Department and the Tulare County Probation Department initiated a partnership and mutual agreement for the Thunderbolt Program in July of 1998. Since 2001, the agreement has provided for two days per week service by a probation officer. The program has since changed its name to the Non-Custody Intake Program.

OUTSTANDING ISSUES

None.

DISCUSSION

The Non-Custody Intake Program is a worthwhile alternative for the youth of our community, which provides informal probation for first-time offenders instead of charging them with a formal criminal record. The estimated cost of the program for fiscal year 2020-21 is \$15,388. The Police Department's fiscal year 2020-2021 budget reflects a yearly allocation of \$15,388 to assist in the costs associated with the officer's salary, benefits and transportation for this program.

The Fourth Amendment for the FY 2020-21 program is enclosed herein as Attachment 'A'. The breakdown of costs is enclosed as Attachment 'B', and the original agreement that was entered into in 2016 is enclosed as Attachment 'C'.

FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated program for the FY 2020-21 budget will be \$15,388. There are sufficient funds in the budget to cover this program.

AGREEMENT
City of Dinuba

I. INTRODUCTION

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into as of July 19, 2016, between the COUNTY OF TULARE, referred to as COUNTY, and the CITY OF DINUBA, referred to as CITY, with reference to the following:

II. RECITALS

A. The CITY desires to benefit from the services of a Probation Officer employed by the COUNTY for the Non-Custody Intake Program;

B. The parties are willing to enter into this Agreement upon the terms and conditions set forth;

C. Both parties intend for this agreement to replace and supersede all existing contracts for the provision of the Probation Officer services for Non-Custody Intake Program.

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS AGREED:

III. SPECIFIC TERMS

1. **TERM:** This Agreement shall become effective as of July 01, 2016 and shall expire at 11:59 PM on June 30, 2017 unless otherwise terminated as provided in this Agreement.

2. **SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED:** The COUNTY shall provide to CITY two-fifths (2/5) of one Deputy Probation Officer full-time position, (two days per week). "Full-time" shall be deemed as no less than 20 hours (50%) and a maximum of 40 hours per week.

The Probation Officer shall provide services relative to minors within Section 602 of the welfare and Institutions Code.

- a) Out-of-custody intake of 602 referrals within the City;
- b) Diversion of juvenile offenders into meaningful and effective programs for the purpose of preventing their activities from escalating in a manner that may require that they be declared wards of the Juvenile Court;
- c) Supervision of minors placed on informal probation within the provisions of Section 654 of the Welfare and Institutions Code;
- d) Assistance in developing community-based delinquency prevention programs in conjunction with the Dinuba Police Department, schools and community-based youth organizations;

- e) Activities may change as requested by written agreement of both parties.

3. **REIMBURSEMENT OF COSTS:** The CITY agrees to reimburse the COUNTY fifty percent (50%) of all costs of the two-fifths (2/5) Probation Officer's salary, benefits, communication and transportation costs, including Workers' Compensation insurance and retirement contributions, and the COUNTY agrees to pay the balance of said costs. The COUNTY will bill the CITY at the end of each quarter for the costs and expenses incurred during the quarter, and the CITY shall pay the invoice within thirty (30) days of receipt. All billings shall be directed to the Dinuba Chief of Police.

4. **OFFICE:** The office for the probation officer shall be located at a designated Dinuba Police Department site.

IV. GENERAL TERMS

5. **EMPLOYEE STATUS:** It is mutually understood and agreed that the Probation Officer(s) at all times while carrying out this Agreement shall be acting as COUNTY employee(s) and shall have the status of independent contractor(s) as to the CITY. The COUNTY shall retain the right to control and direct the services of the Probation Officer(s) assigned pursuant to this Agreement, and shall retain the usual management rights, powers and authority of an employer over such employee(s). This Agreement is entered into by both parties with the express understanding that COUNTY will perform all services required under this Agreement as an independent contractor. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to constitute the COUNTY or any of its agents, employees or officers as an agent, employee or officer of CITY.

6. **COMPLIANCE WITH LAW:** COUNTY shall provide services in accordance with applicable Federal, State, and local laws, regulations and directives. With respect to COUNTY'S employees, COUNTY shall comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to wages and hours, state and federal income tax, unemployment insurance, Social Security, disability insurance, workers' compensation insurance, and discrimination in employment.

7. **GOVERNING LAW:** This Agreement shall be interpreted and governed under the laws of the State of California without reference to California conflicts of law principles. The parties agree that this contract is made in and shall be performed in Tulare County, California.

8. **RECORDS AND AUDIT:** CITY shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to the services rendered and the costs incurred under this Agreement. In addition, CITY shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to any payments to employees or subcontractors. All such records shall be prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting procedures, shall be clearly identified, and shall be kept

readily accessible. Upon request, CITY shall make such records available within Tulare County to the Auditor of Tulare County and to his agents and representatives, for the purpose of auditing and/or copying such records for a period of five (5) years from the date of final payment under this Agreement.

9. CONFLICT OF INTEREST:

(a) CITY agrees to, at all times during the performance of this Agreement, comply with the law of the State of California regarding conflicts of interests and appearance of conflicts of interests, including, but not limited to Government Code Section 1090 et seq., and the Political Reform Act, Government Code Section 81000 et seq. and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto by the California Fair Political Practices Commission. The statutes, regulations and laws previously referenced include, but are not limited to, prohibitions against any public officer or employee, including CITY for this purpose, from making any decision on behalf of COUNTY in which such officer, employee or consultant/contractor has a direct or indirect financial interest. A violation can occur if the public officer, employee or consultant/contractor participates in or influences any COUNTY decision which has the potential to confer any pecuniary benefit on CITY or any business firm in which CITY has an interest, with certain narrow exceptions.

(b) CITY agrees that if any facts come to its attention, which raise any questions as to the applicability of conflicts of interests laws, it will immediately inform the COUNTY designated representative and provide all information needed for resolution of this question.

10.INSURANCE: Each of the parties to this Agreement is an entity which is self-insured and/ or carries liability insurance. Each party will provide liability coverage for its negligent or intentionally wrongful acts and/ or omissions in the performance of its duties under this Agreement.

11.INDEMNIFICATION: The CITY and the COUNTY shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify each other, their agents, officers and employees from and against any liability, claims, actions, costs, damages or losses of any kind, including death or injury to any person and/or damage to property, arising out of their activities or those of their agents, officers or employees under this Agreement. This indemnification obligation shall continue beyond the term of this Agreement as to any acts or omissions occurring under this Agreement or any extension of this Agreement.

12. TERMINATION:

(a) Without Cause: Either party will have the right to terminate this Agreement without cause by giving ninety (90) days prior written notice of intention to terminate pursuant to this provision, specifying the date of termination. CITY will pay to the

COUNTY the compensation earned for work performed and not previously paid for to the date of termination.

(b) With Cause: This Agreement may be terminated by either party should the other party:

- (1) be adjudged a bankrupt, or
- (2) become insolvent or have a receiver appointed, or
- (3) make a general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or
- (4) suffer any judgment which remains unsatisfied for 30 days, and which would substantively impair the ability of the judgment debtor to perform under this Agreement, or
- (5) materially breach this Agreement.

In addition, COUNTY may terminate this Agreement based on:

- (6) material misrepresentation, either by CITY or anyone acting on CITY's behalf, as to any matter related in any way to CITY'S retention of COUNTY, or
- (7) other misconduct or circumstances which, in the sole discretion of the COUNTY, either impair the ability of COUNTY to competently provide the services under this Agreement, or expose the COUNTY to an unreasonable risk of liability.

(c) Effects of Termination: Expiration or termination of this Agreement shall not terminate any obligations to indemnify, to maintain and make available any records pertaining to the Agreement, to cooperate with any audit, to be subject to offset, or to make any reports of pre-termination contract activities. Where COUNTY'S services have been terminated by the CITY, said termination will not affect any rights of the COUNTY to recover damages against the CITY.

(d) Suspension of Performance: Independent of any right to terminate this Agreement, the authorized representative of COUNTY may immediately suspend performance by COUNTY, in whole or in part, in response to health, safety or financial emergency, or a failure or refusal by CITY to comply with the provisions of this Agreement, until such time as the cause for suspension is resolved, or a notice of termination becomes effective.

13. LOSS OF FUNDING: It is understood and agreed that if the funding is either discontinued or reduced for this project for the COUNTY or CITY, that the COUNTY or CITY shall have the right to terminate this Agreement. In such event, the affected party shall provide the other party with at least thirty (30) days prior written notice of such termination

14. NOTICES:

(a) Except as may be otherwise required by law, any notice to be given shall be written and shall be either personally delivered, sent by facsimile transmission or sent by first class mail, postage prepaid and addressed as follows:

(b) Notice personally delivered is effective when delivered. Notice sent by facsimile transmission is deemed to be received upon successful transmission. Notice sent by first class mail shall be deemed received on the fifth day after the date of mailing. Either party may change the above address by giving written notice pursuant to this paragraph.

15. DISPUTE RESOLUTION: If a dispute arises out of or relating to this Agreement, or the breach thereof, and if said dispute cannot be settled through negotiation, the parties agree first to try in good faith to settle the dispute by non-binding mediation before resorting to litigation or some other dispute resolution procedure, unless the parties mutually agree otherwise. The mediator shall be mutually selected by the parties, but in case of disagreement, the mediator shall be selected by lot from among two nominations provided by each party. All costs and fees required by the mediator shall be split equally by the parties, otherwise each party shall bear its own costs of mediation. If mediation fails to resolve the dispute within 30 days, either party may pursue litigation to resolve the dispute.

16. FURTHER ASSURANCES: Each party will execute any additional documents and perform any further acts that may be reasonably required to effect the purposes of this Agreement.

17. CONSTRUCTION: This Agreement reflects the contributions of all undersigned parties and accordingly the provisions of Civil Code section 1654 shall not apply to address and interpret any alleged uncertainty or ambiguity.

18. **HEADINGS:** Section headings are provided for organizational purposes only and do not in any manner affect the scope, meaning or intent of the provisions under the headings.

19. **NO THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARIES INTENDED:** Unless specifically set forth, the parties to this Agreement do not intend to provide any other party with any benefit or enforceable legal or equitable right or remedy.

20. **WAIVERS:** The failure of either party to insist on strict compliance with any provision of this Agreement shall not be considered a waiver of any right to do so, whether for that breach or any subsequent breach. The acceptance by either party of either performance or payment shall not be considered to be a waiver of any preceding breach of the Agreement by the other party.

21. **EXHIBITS AND RECITALS:** The recitals and the exhibits to this Agreement are fully incorporated into and are integral parts of this Agreement.

22. **CONFLICT WITH LAWS OR REGULATIONS/SEVERABILITY:** This Agreement is subject to all applicable laws and regulations. If any provision of this Agreement is found by any court or other legal authority, or is agreed by the parties to be, in conflict with any code or regulation governing its subject matter, only the conflicting provision shall be considered null and void. If the effect of nullifying any conflicting provision is such that a material benefit of the Agreement to either party is lost, the Agreement may be terminated at the option of the affected party. In all other cases the remainder of the Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

23. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT REPRESENTED:** This Agreement represents the entire agreement between CITY and COUNTY as to its subject matter and no prior oral or written understanding shall be of any force or effect. No part of this Agreement may be modified without the written consent of both parties.

24. **ASSURANCES OF NON-DISCRIMINATION:** CITY shall not discriminate in employment or in the provision of services on the basis of any characteristic or condition upon which discrimination is prohibited by state or federal law or regulation.

(a) It is recognized that both the City and the County have the responsibility to protect County employees and clients from unlawful activities, including discrimination and sexual harassment in the workplace. Accordingly, City agrees to provide appropriate training to its employees regarding discrimination and sexual harassment issues, and to promptly and appropriately investigate any allegations that any of its employees may have engaged in improper discrimination or harassment activities. The County, in its sole discretion, has the right to require City to replace any employee who provides services of any kind to County pursuant to this Agreement with other employees where County is concerned that its employees or clients may have been or may be the subjects of

discrimination or harassment by such employees. The right to require replacement of employees as aforesaid shall not preclude County from terminating this Agreement with or without cause as provided for herein.

RECOMMENDATION

Council by one motion take the following actions:

1. Adopt Resolution Number 2020-21 approving the Final Map for the Autumn Gate Phase II (i.e. Vista Robles Phase II) subdivision consisting of 40 residential lots and authorize City staff to record said map.
2. Approve the Subdivision Development Agreement for Autumn Gate Phase II (i.e. Vista Robles Phase II) and authorize the City Manager or designee to execute the agreement.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

San Joaquin Valley Homes is developing the Autumn Gate subdivision, also known as Vista Robles, located on the north side of Nebraska Avenue between Viscaya Parkway and Euclid Avenue. The vesting map for the subdivision consists of a total of 138 lots. The developer is constructing the development in phases; phase II consists of 40 lots. In order for the developer to be able to sell homes in phase II, the final map must first be approved by the City Council and the map must be recorded with the County. The developer is also required, as a condition of approval, to enter into a Subdivision Development Agreement with the City. The subdivision agreement details the work to be completed by the developer and provides a schedule for when the work will be completed.

OUTSTANDING ISSUES

None.

DISCUSSION

On March 28, 2006, the City approved a vesting tentative subdivision map for the Autumn Gate subdivision consisting of 138 lots located on the north side of Nebraska Avenue between Viscaya Parkway and Euclid Avenue. The project never developed due to the housing crash in 2008 followed by the Great Recession in 2009.

The Autumn Gate subdivision was purchased by San Joaquin Valley (SJV) Homes, a Visalia-based homebuilder. SJV has completed several projects in Dinuba totaling over 180 homes. SJV is developing Autumn Gate in phases. Phase I consisted of 59 lots on 18.42 acres. Phase II consists of 40 lots on 10.87 acres and the final map is included as "Exhibit A" of the attached Resolution Number 2020-21 enclosed herein as Attachment 'A'. Upon review by the City Engineer the final map conforms to the approved tentative tract map and City and State standards. It is recommended that the final map be recorded with the Tulare County Recorder's Office.

As a condition of all subdivisions, the developer is required to enter into an subdivision agreement with the City of Dinuba. The subdivision agreement details the work to be completed by the developer, amount of security for improvements, and fees to be paid as part of the subdivision. The work includes roads, sewer, water, gas and storm drain and private utility improvements to serve the subdivision. The agreement also requires the developer to

provide bonds and other security instruments in an amount necessary to cover the cost of the improvements. For this project, the estimated cost of improvements total \$1,636,853. The City may call on the bonds should the developer fail to complete the improvements in a timely manner.

As part of the development, the developer has agreed to install additional improvements along Euclid Avenue as requested by the City. These improvements will build out the unimproved sections on both sides of Euclid Avenue from Nebraska Avenue south to Roosevelt Elementary School (i.e., pavement, curb, gutter and sidewalks improvements). The cost of these additional improvements total \$487,717 and will be credited to the developer from transportation development impact fees. This work and the credits is covered in the subdivision agreement.

A copy of the subdivision agreement is enclosed herein as Attachment "B." The developer is required to have all public improvements completed by July 30, 2020.

FISCAL IMPACT

The City will receive approximately \$16,100 per unit for all impact fees and approximately \$2,000 for building permit and development fees for each residential unit. These fees will be collected with the issuance of each building permit. Final map and plan check and inspection fees will be collected at the time the Final map is recorded with the Tulare County Recorder's Office.

5. That the City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution and that the same shall be in full force and effect.

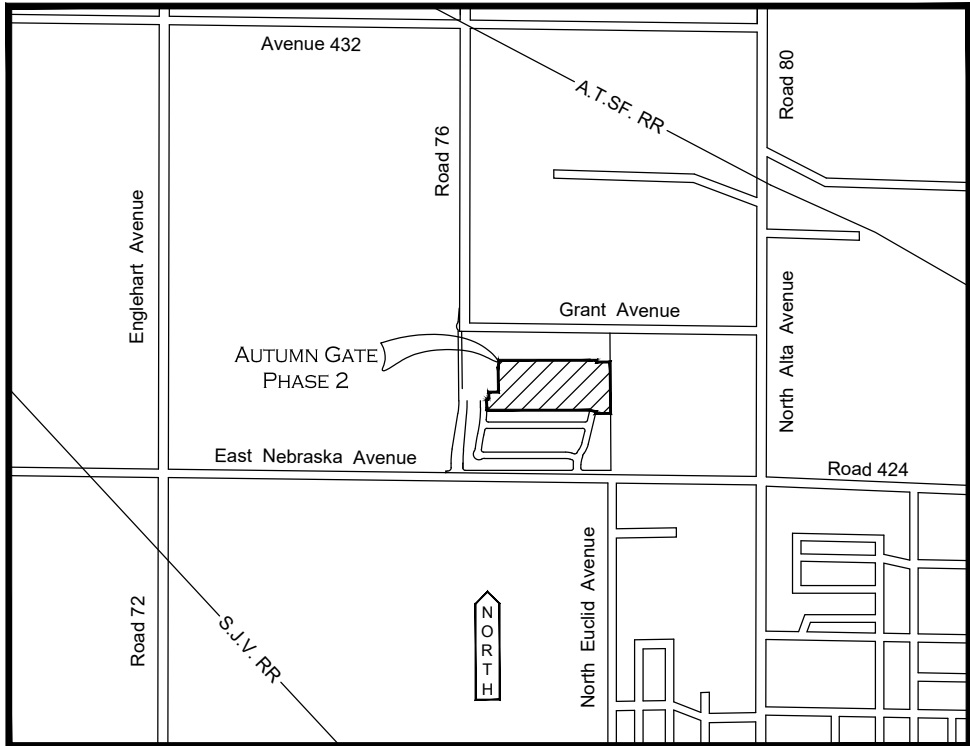

CITY OF DINUBA
SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT
AUTUMN GATE DEVELOPMENT
PHASE II

This Agreement is made and entered into this ____ day of _____, 2020 by and between the City of Dinuba, a Municipal Corporation of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as “**City**”, and Presidio JJR Master VI, LLC, a Delaware Limited Liability Company, herein referred to as “**Subdivider**”.

WITNESS TO

Subdivider has presented to the **City** a Final Map for the proposed subdivision of land located within the City of Dinuba and described as Autumn Gate, Phase II, a copy of said Map is attached.

Said **Subdivider** has requested that the **City** accept the dedications delineated and shown on said Map for the uses and purposes specified thereon and to otherwise approve said Map in order that same may be recorded, as required by law.

The **City** requires, as a condition precedent to the acceptance and approval of said Map: (a) the irrevocable dedication to the City of Dinuba, of the land wherein the streets are delineated as shown on said Map, which the **City** deems necessary for public use; and (b) that any and all streets delineated and shown on said Map be improved by the construction and installation of improvements hereinafter specified.

The Dinuba Municipal Code requires **Subdivider** enter into this agreement with the **City** before all required work has been completed by **Subdivider** at the time the Final Map is submitted.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the irrevocable offer of dedication of the streets, highways, easements and facilities as shown on said Map, and the approval of said Map for filing and recording as required by law, it is mutually agreed as follows:

1. SCHEDULE OF PERFORMANCE BY SUBDIVIDER

- A.** The work schedule hereinafter set forth contains the dates when the work required to be performed by **Subdivider** shall be completed. Such work shall be installed and completed to the satisfaction of the City Engineer. Extension to the work schedule for required improvements shall be requested by **Subdivider** in writing. The City Engineer may consider this schedule of performance in determining whether or not to grant any such extension. The City Engineer’s determination shall be final and conclusive. Failure of **Subdivider** to perform in accordance with the schedule shall constitute prima facie evidence of failure to diligently prosecute the work required hereunder. **No building permits shall be issued until the water**

system improvements have been completed with operational fire hydrants and the construction of weather-proof streets approved by the Dinuba Fire Chief. No Certificate of Occupancy shall be issued for any residence in the subdivision until all public improvements needed to serve the residences have been completed by Subdivider and accepted by the City Engineer. The work schedule is as follows:

- B. NOT WITHSTANDING THE ABOVE**, all street work and public improvements required to be constructed by **Subdivider** shall be fully completed and suitable for acceptance by the **City** not later than July 30, 2020.
- C.** Failure of **Subdivider** to meet such deadline shall constitute a material breach of the Agreement. In such event, the Subdivision Irrevocable Instruments of Credit, hereinafter described, shall thereupon immediately be paid to the **City** and the **City** shall have permission to go upon the property and complete all work and public improvements, including construction or reinstallation, as the **City** deems necessary, of all utility facilities, streets, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, sanitary sewer, water, storm drainage systems and other public and private improvements, which were not properly or fully completed or installed by **Subdivider**.
- D.** Issuance of building permits for any structure within a subdivision shall conform to the requirements of the latest edition of the Title 24 California Building, California Fire and Green Building Codes. All public improvements which serve the property for which an occupancy permit is sought shall have been completed and accepted by the **City**.

2. ROAD IMPROVEMENTS TO BE COMPLETED BY SUBDIVIDER

- A.** **Subdivider** shall retain a Geotechnical firm and pay for any materials testing required by the City. The sampling and testing shall be done by a registered and licensed Geotechnical materials testing firm.
- B.** **Subdivider** shall construct all required improvements in accordance with this Agreement, the approved improvement plans (executed on January 21, 2020), the 2007 Edition of the City's Public Improvements Standards and the conditions of approval of the Tentative Map.

3. SEWER AND WATER IMPROVEMENTS TO BE COMPLETED BY SUBDIVIDER

- A. Subdivider** shall construct the sanitary sewer system and appurtenances in accordance with this Agreement, the approved improvement plans (executed on January 21, 2020), the 2007 Edition of the City's Public Improvements Standards and the conditions of approval of the Tentative Map.
- B. Subdivider** shall construct a domestic water system and appurtenances in accordance with this Agreement, the approved improvement plans (executed on January 21, 2020), the 2007 Edition of the City's Public Improvements Standards, and the conditions of the Tentative Map.

4. GAS AND ELECTRICAL LINES TO BE COMPLETED BY SUBDIVIDER

- A. Subdivider** shall place underground all gas mains, services and all existing and new telephone and electrical lines, including cable television. This includes placing underground all existing facilities within the limits of this subdivision and service lines thereto. The **Subdivider** shall make arrangements with Pacific Gas and Electric, Southern California Gas Company, AT&T, and Comcast to guarantee the installation of these facilities, including bonding for same.

5. STORM DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS TO BE COMPLETED BY SUBDIVIDER

- A. Subdivider** shall construct the storm drainage system and appurtenances within this subdivision in accordance with this Agreement, the approved improvement plans (executed on January 21, 2020), the City's 2007 Public Improvement Standards and Specifications and the conditions of approval of the Tentative Map.

6. ADDITIONAL IMPROVEMENTS REQUIREMENTS

- A. Subdivider** is responsible for all work and maintenance within the City's rights-of-way. Any damaged caused by **Subdivider** and/or their subcontractors shall be repaired at no expense to the City of Dinuba.
- B.** Prior to commencement of any work within the rights-of-way not included in the approved improvement plans (executed on January 21, 2020), or any work performed within an existing City maintained street, an encroachment permit shall be obtained from the Public Works Services Department.
- C. Subdivider** shall cause to be placed by a licensed Civil Engineer or Land Surveyor all survey monuments and lot corners as shown on the Final Map. Pursuant to Section 66497 of the State Subdivision Map Act, prior to the City's final acceptance of the subdivision and release of the securities, **Subdivider** shall submit written

certification to the City Engineer that all monuments required in the subdivision have been set.

- D.** **Subdivider** shall furnish to the City Engineer a set of “Record Drawings” plans, prepared by a registered civil engineer, for all work performed in all rights-of-way prior to a Notice of Completion. These plans shall include the location of all underground City and available utility companies’ utilities.
- E.** In the event an extension is granted by the City Engineer to complete any of the required public and private improvements in this subdivision, **Subdivider** shall comply with all applicable City Improvement Standards.
- F.** All conditions of approval of the Tentative Map, plan of services, the improvement plans and the City Public Improvement Standards apply to and are included by reference in this Agreement.
- G.** Grading of the lots shall conform to the grades shown on the approved grading plan and the improvement plans. Prior to acceptance of the work by the **City** and release of the subdivision security, **Subdivider** shall provide the **City** with a statement from a registered civil engineer that, based on information provided by the Contractor, work performed within this tract conforms with the approved improvement plans (executed on January 21, 2020), the recommendations contained in the soils report and the City Public Improvement Standards.
- H.** The required decorative block wall shall consist of split-faced concrete block and shall have a brick or tile cap placed along the top of the wall, said wall shall meet or exceed the quality of the wall constructed along Viscaya Parkway in Dinuba, CA and shall be painted with graffiti-resistant paint.
- I.** Entrance treatments, decorative walls, “circles” and other design details shall be constructed with a common design theme subject to **City** approval.

7. SECURITIES

- A.** Prior to approval by the City Council of the Autumn Gate, Phase II, **Subdivider** shall submit to the **City** a Performance Bond in a form acceptable to the **City** in an amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the estimated cost of the required public improvements and private utility improvements in the amount of **\$1,636,853** to guarantee the proper construction of the improvements required in this Agreement, the City’s Public Improvement Standards, and the conditions of the Tentative Map.
- B.** Prior to approval of the Final Map by the **City**, **Subdivider** shall submit to the **City** a Materials and Labor Bond in a form acceptable to the **City** in an amount equal to fifty percent (50%) of the estimated cost of the required public improvements and private utilities improvements, in the amount of **\$818,427** to secure payment of all

contractors and subcontractors performing the work on said improvements and all persons furnishing labor, materials and equipment used for installation of said improvements.

- C. Prior to issuance of Notice of Completion of Autumn Gate, Phase II by the **City**, **Subdivider** shall submit to the **City** an Irrevocable Instrument of Credit in a form acceptable to the **City** to guarantee and warranty maintenance of all required public improvements herein, for a period of one (1) year following acceptance, in an amount equal to ten percent (10%) of the estimated cost of the improvements, for Autumn Gate, Phase II, in the amount of **\$163,685**. Said Irrevocable Instrument of Credit shall be released to **Subdivider**, less any amount required to be used for fulfillment of the warranty, one (1) year after final acceptance of the subdivision improvements by the **City**.
- D. The Improvement Security Bonds for performance and for labor and materials, but not including the warranty security, will remain in effect until such time as all required improvements in Autumn Gate, Phase II are satisfactorily completed and the subdivision has been formally accepted by the **City**. Such securities may be released only upon written authority of the City Engineer.
- E. The Improvement Security Bonds required under this paragraph shall be payable to the **City**. Security bonds shall remain in force until recordation of the Notice of Completion.
- F. Upon failure of **Subdivider** to properly complete the required improvements in a form acceptable to the City Engineer by July 30, 2020, the **City** shall be entitled to immediately draw upon the subdivision Improvement Securities (Performance and Payment Bonds) and cause the required improvements to be installed and/or repaired without further notice to **Subdivider**.

8. INDEMNITY AND INSURANCE

- A. The **City** shall not be liable to **Subdivider** or to any other person, firm or corporation whatsoever for any injury or damage that may result to any person or property by or from any cause whatsoever, on or about the subdivision of said land covered by this agreement, or any part thereof. **Subdivider** hereby releases and agrees to indemnify, defend and save the **City** and its agents, officials and employees harmless from and against any and all injuries to and death of persons and damages to property, and all claims directly or indirectly from the performance of any or all work to be done in and upon the premises adjacent thereto pursuant to this Agreement, and also from all injuries to and deaths of persons, and damage to property, all claims, demands, costs, losses, damage and liability, howsoever same may be caused, either directly or indirectly made or suffered by **Subdivider**, **Subdivider's** agents, employees and subcontractors, while engaged in the performance of said work. **Subdivider** further agrees that the use, for any purpose and by any person, of any and all the streets and improvements hereinbefore

specified shall be at the sole and exclusive risk of **Subdivider** at all times prior to final acceptance by the **City** of all completed street and other improvements thereon and therein.

B. Insurance Requirements for Subdivider:

Subdivider shall procure and maintain for the duration of the contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by **Subdivider**, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors.

1. Minimum scope of insurance – coverage shall be at least as broad as:
 - a. Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability coverage (occurrence form CG0001).
 - b. Insurance Services Office form number CA0001 covering automobile liability, Code 1 (any auto).
 - c. Worker's compensation Insurance as required by the State of California and Employer's Liability Insurance.
2. Minimum limits of insurance – **Subdivider** shall maintain limits no less than:
 - a. General liability: \$2,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If Commercial General Liability or other form with a general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
 - b. Automobile liability: \$2,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If Commercial General Liability or other form with a general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
 - c. Employee liability: \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property.
 - d. Course of construction: complete value of the project.
3. Deductibles and self-insured retention – any deductibles or self-insured retention must be declared to and approved by the Entity. At the option of the Entity, either the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retention as requested by the Entity, its officers, officials,

employees and volunteers, or **Subdivider** shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations claim administration and defense expenses.

4. Other insurance provisions – the general liability and automobile liability policies shall contain, or endorse to contain, the following provisions:

- a. The Entity, its officers, agents and volunteers are to be covered as insured in respect to: liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of **Subdivider**, products and completed operations of **Subdivider**, premises owned, occupied, or used by **Subdivider**, or automobiles, owned, leased, hired or borrowed by **Subdivider**. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the Entity, its officers, officials, employees, agents or volunteers.
- b. For any claims related to this project, **Subdivider's** insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects to the Entity, its officers, officials, employees, agents, or volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Entity, its officers, officials, employees, agents, or volunteers shall be in excess of **Subdivider's** insurance and shall not contribute to it.
- c. Any failure to comply with reporting or other provisions of the policies including breaches of warranties shall not affect coverage provided by the Entity, its officers, officials, employees, agents or volunteers.
- d. **Subdivider's** insurance shall apply separately to each insured against which suit is brought except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- e. Each insurance policy required by this clause shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be suspended, voided, cancelled by either party, reduced on coverage or in limits except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested has been given to the Entity.

5. Course of Construction policies shall contain the following provisions.

- a. Entity shall be named as loss payee.
- b. The insurer shall waive all rights of subornation on against Entity.

6. Acceptability of insurers – insurance is to be placed with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A: VII.
7. Verification of coverage – **Subdivider** shall furnish the Entity with original endorsements effecting coverage required by this clause. The endorsements are to be signed by a person authorized by the insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. The endorsements are to be on forms provided by the Entity. All endorsements are to be received and approved by the Entity before work commences. As an alternative to the Entity forms, **Subdivider's** insurer may provide complete, certified, copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements affecting the coverage required by these specifications.
8. Subcontractors – **Subdivider** shall include all subcontractors as insured under its policies and shall furnish separate certificates and endorsements for each subcontractor. All coverage for subcontractors shall be subject to all of the requirements stated herein.

9. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- A. **Subdivider** shall remedy any defective work or labor or any defective materials and pay for any damage to other work resulting within a period of one (1) year from the date of recordation of the Notice of Completion.
- B. **Subdivider** and his subcontractors shall pay for any materials, provisions and other supplies used in, upon, form or about the performance of the work contracted to be done, and for any work or labor thereon of any kind, and for amounts due under the Unemployment Insurance Act of the State of California, with respect to such work or labor, and shall file with the **City** pursuant to Section 3800 of the Labor Code, a certificate of Worker's Compensation for the duration of the period of construction.
- C. **Subdivider** shall comply with the latest edition of State of California, Title 24, Building, Mechanical, Plumbing, Electrical, and Zoning Codes and any other codes of the **City** and the City of Dinuba and State of California.
- D. It shall be the responsibility of **Subdivider** to coordinate all the work done by his contractors and subcontractors, such as scheduling the sequence of operations and the determination of liability if one operation delays another. In no case shall representatives of the **City** be placed in the position of making decisions that are the responsibility of **Subdivider** to give the City Engineer written notice not less than two (2) working days in advance of the actual date on which work is to be started. Failure on the part of **Subdivider** to notify the City Engineer may cause delays for which **Subdivider** shall be solely responsible.
- E. Whenever **Subdivider** varies the period during which work is carried on each day, he shall give due notice to the City Engineer so that proper inspection may be

provided. If **Subdivider** fails to duly notify the **City** as herein required, any work done in the absence of the City Engineer will be subject to rejection. The inspection of the work shall not relieve **Subdivider** of any of his obligations to fulfill the Agreement as prescribed. Defective work shall be made good, and suitable materials may be rejected notwithstanding the fact that such defective work and unsuitable materials were not previously identified by the City Engineer or Inspector and accepted.

- F. Any damage to the underground utilities, concrete work or street paving that occurs after construction shall be made good to the satisfaction of the City Engineer by **Subdivider** before release of securities, or final acceptance of the complete work. When the pavement on any existing street is disturbed or removed, such pavement shall be replaced immediately with temporary or other approved temporary pavement/surfacing methods until the permanent pavement is placed. The temporary pavement shall be maintained in a safe and passable condition at all times between the commencement and final completion of all construction.
- G. Time is of the essence of this Agreement and same shall bind and insure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.
- H. No assignment of the Agreement or of any duty of obligation of performance hereunder shall be made in whole or in part by **Subdivider** without prior written consent of the **City**.
- I. **Subdivider** shall pay development impact fees as adjusted by the City Council on September 25, 2018, for each of the **40** single family dwelling units to be constructed in the Autumn Gate Phase II Subdivision as follows:

From this amount, **Subdivider** will receive fee credits as identified in section 9.N, below. Credits due **Subdivider** will be applied to appropriate facility category. Fee credits will be applied on a per lot basis until total fee credits due to **Subdivider** are depleted. **City** will not issue payment of fee credits to Subdivider in one lump sum. Once fee credits due are exhausted, any remaining impact fees due the **City** shall be paid along with the issuance of each residential building permit. In the event that fee credits exceed the total due for the corresponding facility category, credit balance will be carried over to subsequent phases of development unless

development is constructed in a single phase or if this agreement is for the final phase.

J. **Subdivider** shall be aware that fees listed in this agreement largely pertain to infrastructure impact fees and are therefore not all-inclusive. In addition to the identified impact fees **Subdivider** shall pay building permit, meter set, hook-up fees, school fees and any other related fees with the issuance of each building permit for each residential unit.

K. A public improvements inspection fee (4% of the value of the public improvements) and public improvements plan check fee (3% of the value of the public improvements) shall be paid to the **City** before the beginning of any construction. Said fees are estimates and may be increased by the **City**, if necessary.

L. The **Subdivider** shall, upon recordation of the Final Map, pay the following fees:

N. The **Subdivider** shall receive fee credits as identified in Engineer's Estimate dated February 4, 2020 prepared by Lars Anderson & Associates Inc., as follows:

Upon completion of the required Public Improvements, **Subdivider** shall submit evidence of actual construction costs and the City Engineer will perform a review and reconciliation. If the fee credits identified above were overestimated, **Subdivider** will immediately issue payment of the difference to the **City**. If the fee credits due under this section were underestimated, the **City** and **Subdivider** will, by mutual agreement, determine how to settle outstanding fee credits.

- O.** The provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, successors and assigns of the parties hereto.
- P.** In the event litigation is brought to enforce the terms of or interpret this agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to an award of attorney fees and costs, including expert witness fees.
- Q.** **Subdivider** shall be responsible for obtaining any and all permits as required by the State, County, and other agencies prior to start of construction (NPDES Storm water permit, etc.).

10. SPECIAL DISTRICT FORMATION

- A.** **Subdivider** and **City** may form a Community Facilities District or Districts (or other public finance district under State law, as appropriate) for the purpose of financing the construction and/or acquisition of public infrastructure and facilities within the Project area or for the provision of services (“Project CFD(s)”). If requested by **Subdivider**, **City** may determine whether to form one or more Project CFD(s) for the purpose of providing services or financing for the acquisition or reconstruction of some or all of the improvements and facilities eligible for CFD financing within and associated with the Project, including those improvements which will mitigate impacts of the Project upon areas inside and outside of the Project with a useful life of 5 years or longer, and will be owned operated and maintained by the **City** or another public agency as authorized under Government code section 53311 *et seq.* and **City** policy.
- B.** **Subdivider** further consents to the levying of the initial special tax as established pursuant to applicable State law, **City** Municipal Code requirements, and **City** procedures.
- C.** It is herewith further understood and agreed that **Subdivider** shall provide to each purchaser of a lot within this Subdivision a Notice of the formation of a public finance district which shall inform said purchaser that the real property being purchased is within the boundaries of a public finance district and is therefore subject to an special tax levy in perpetuity.

11. DUST CONTROL

- A.** Adequate dust control shall be maintained by **Subdivider** on all streets within and outside the subdivision on which work is required to be done under this Agreement from the time work is first commenced in the subdivision until the paving of the streets is completed. “Adequate dust control” as used herein shall mean the sprinkling of the streets with water thereon with sufficient frequency to prevent the

scattering of dust by wind of the activity of vehicles and equipment onto any street area or private property adjacent to subdivision.

- B.** Whenever in the opinion of the City Engineer adequate dust control is not being maintained on any street or streets as required by this paragraph, the City Engineer shall give notice to **Subdivider** to comply with the provisions of this paragraph forthwith. Such notice may be personally served upon **Subdivider** or, if **Subdivider** is not an individual, upon any person who has signed this agreement on behalf of **Subdivider** or, at the election of the City Engineer, such notice may be mailed to **Subdivider** at his address on file with the City Engineer. If, within twenty-four (24) hours after such personal service of such notice or with forty-eight hours after the mailing thereof as herein provided, **Subdivider** shall not have commenced to maintain adequate dust control or shall at any time thereafter fail to maintain adequate dust control the City Engineer may, without further notice of any kind, cause any such street or streets to be sprinkled or oiled, as he may deem advisable, to eliminate the scattering of dust, by equipment and personnel of the **City** or by contract as the City Engineer shall determine. **Subdivider** shall pay to the **City** forthwith, upon receipt of billing therefore, the entire cost to the **City** of such sprinkling.
- C.** A permit is required by the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District or for the construction.
- D.** The Best Management Practices and SWPPP documents required by the State shall be provided and implemented prior to any work commenced.

RECOMMENDATION

Council conduct the second reading, waive reading in full, and adopt Ordinance 2020-02 pertaining to a zone change for two parcels at the northwest corner of E. Magnolia Way and California Street.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City Council introduced the subject ordinance on April 14, 2020. The ordinance is to change the zoning of two parcels at the northwest corner of E. Magnolia Way and California Street from RCO (Resource Conservation) to C-1 (Neighborhood Commercial).

OUTSTANDING ISSUES

None.

DISCUSSION

The project is a proposal to change the zoning and land use designations of two parcels at the northwest corner of E. Magnolia and California Streets. The location is the site of the existing Magnolia Market, and the applicant intends to tear down the building and construct a new market to better meet their needs and to confirm to current codes.

The site is currently zoned RCO (Resource Conservation). The proposed zoning is the C-1 (Neighborhood Commercial) zone. Application of this zone will allow the applicant to redevelop the site with a new market.

If the zone change is approved, the subject ordinance will take effect thirty days from adoption.

FISCAL IMPACT

None.

PUBLIC HEARING

A public hearing to introduce the ordinance was conducted on April 14, 2020. As required by municipal code, the City mailed notices of the proposed use and public hearing to property owners within 300 feet of the site, and tenants within 100 feet of the site. The City also published a legal notice in the Dinuba Sentinel.

ORDINANCE NO. 2020-02

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DINUBA AMENDING THE ZONING OF PARCELS LOCATED ON THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF E. MAGNOLIA WAY AND CALIFORNIA STREET.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DINUBA HEREBY DOES ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS.

- (a) The City of Dinuba administers a Zoning Ordinance (Title 17 of the Dinuba Municipal Code), including a map that designates all parcels of land with specific zoning classifications.
- (b) The purpose of zoning is to facilitate a well-planned City and to avoid land use conflicts, among other objectives.
- (c) The City has received an application to amend the Zoning of specific parcels located at the northwest corner of E. Magnolia Way and California Street. Currently the parcels are zoned RCO (Resource Conservation). The parcels are proposed to be zoned C-1 (Neighborhood Commercial).
- (d) The Assessor Parcel Numbers of the subject parcels are 018-051-007 and 018-051-006.
- (e) The purpose of the zone change is to enable the parcels to be redeveloped with a new convenience market.
- (f) The proposed zone change is shown on Map 1.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY.

Each of the provisions of this ordinance is severable from all other provisions. If any article, section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause a summary of this Ordinance to be published by one insertion in a newspaper of general circulation in the community at least five (5) days prior to adoption and again fifteen (15) days after its adoption. If a summary of the ordinance is published, then the City Clerk shall cause a certified copy of the full text of the proposed ordinance to be posted in the office of the City Clerk at least five days prior to the

Council meeting at which the ordinance is adopted and again after the meeting at which the ordinance is adopted. The summary shall be approved by the City Attorney.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force thirty (30) days from and after its adoption.

SECTION 5. The foregoing Ordinance No. 2020-02 was introduced at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Dinuba on the 14th day of April, 2020, by the following vote:

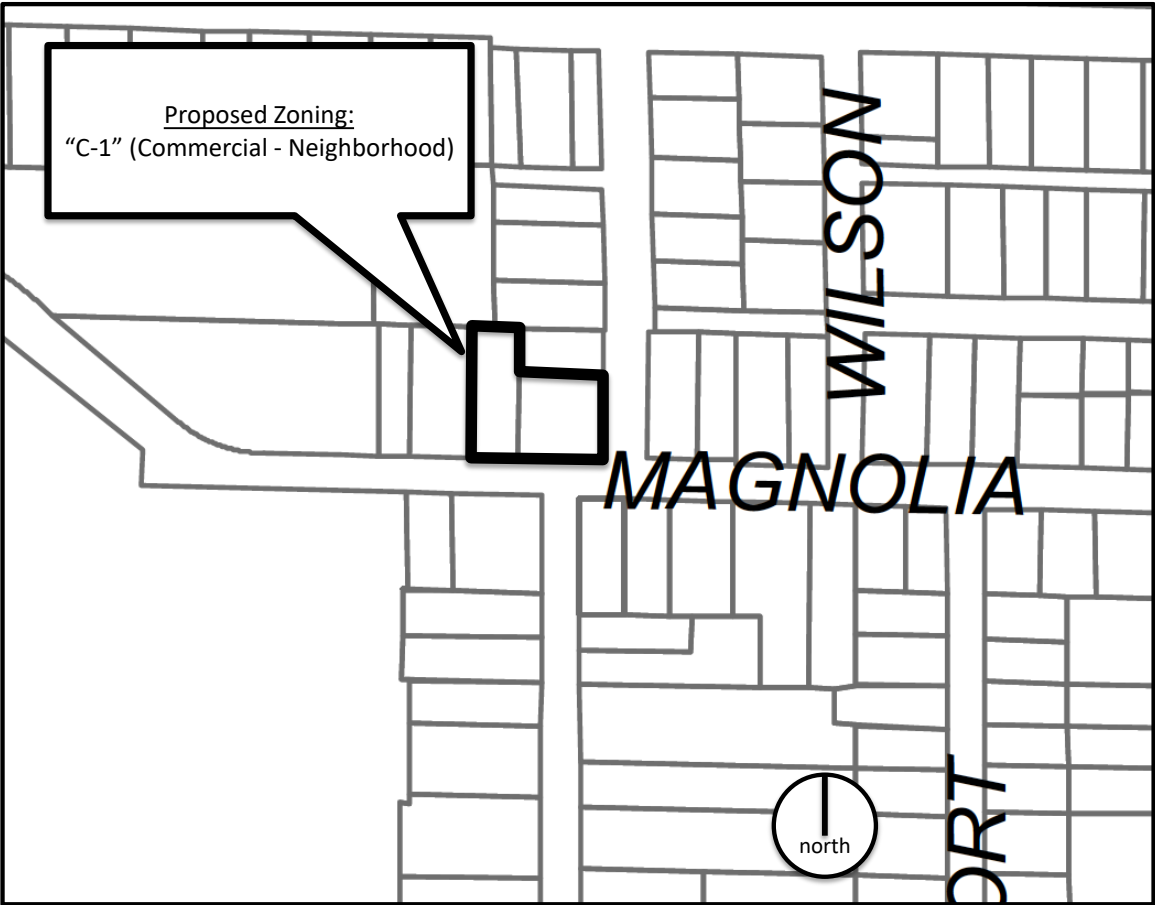

RECOMMENDATION

Council by one motion take the following actions:

1. Hold a public hearing on the proposed Resolutions of Necessity; and,
2. Adopt Resolution No. 2020-19 authorizing the commencement of eminent domain actions to acquire portions of APN 014-071-001, also known as 148 East Nebraska Avenue Dinuba, CA 93618, consisting of a residence.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

On February 13, 2018 Council adopted Resolution 2018-05 approving the Program Supplement for the use of Measure R funds for the design and right-of-way acquisition for the Alta and Nebraska Avenue Roundabout Project and Nebraska Avenue Widening west of Alta Avenue. Right-of-way acquisition is needed as part of this federally funded transportation project. After many failed attempts the City was unable to contact all property owners of record to negotiate a fair right of way acquisition offer. The attached resolution is necessary to commence eminent domain proceedings for acquisition of the remaining land needed for this project.

OUTSTANDING ISSUES

None.

DISCUSSION

The City of Dinuba has been working on the engineering design for a roundabout at Alta and Nebraska Avenues. The project consists of the construction of a single lane roundabout which includes a reconstructed pavement structural section, curb and gutter, curb ramps, sidewalk, median islands, landscape and irrigation, and other miscellaneous street improvements. The roundabout will improve mobility as well as safety at this key intersection.

In order to accommodate the improvements necessary to construct the roundabout, the City needed to obtain additional right of way from twelve (12) affected property owners. In addition, the City needs to obtain right of way from two (2) affected property owners for the widening of Nebraska Avenue. Staff retained a right of way consultant to meet with affected property owners to negotiate the purchase of the needed right of way. The consultant has met with all affected property owners and thirteen (13) have agreed to sell the needed right of way for the project. Pending City Council approval, the final piece of property will be acquired via eminent domain.

In general terms, eminent domain power means the power of government to take private property for a public purpose without the owner's consent and by paying "just compensation".

There are two basic legal restraints on a City in exercising its power of eminent domain:

1. The property to be acquired must be for a "public use".

2. The City must pay "just compensation" to the property owner. These legal restraints are imposed by the California Constitution.

Noteworthy is that the power of eminent domain is invoked only after every effort was made to acquire the property through negotiation with the property owner and is only used as a last resort. The remaining property where a partial right of way acquisition is required for this project is listed in the table below.

Acquisition of this property is necessary for the construction of the proposed roundabout at Alta Avenue and Nebraska Avenue. A written offer (Attachment A) was presented to the owners of record, as required by California Government Code Section 7267.2, accompanied by a copy of the appraisal of the fair market value obtained by the City. The property owner received the first offer on July 24, 2019. In addition, staff followed up with various meetings on August 21, 2019, August 28, 2019, September 11, 2019, November 20, 2019, and finally on March 4, 2020. Through the negotiation process it became clear that the property's title issues could not be resolved. The Property is critical for the construction of the roundabout, therefore, staff recommends the acquisition of the Property via eminent domain in order to proceed with the Project and avoid the loss of grant funding. The City has the power of eminent domain pursuant to Article I, Section 19, of the California Constitution and the California Eminent Domain Law, Code of Civil Procedure §1230.010 et. seq., Government Code §§ 37350, 37350.5, 37351 and 37353, and Streets & Highways Code §10102.

In accordance with the provisions of the California Eminent Domain Law, the City has given notice of this hearing to the property owners, informing them of their right to appear at this hearing and be heard on the following issues: (1) whether the public interest and necessity require the Project; (2) whether the Project is planned or located in the manner that will be most compatible with the greatest good and the least private injury; (3) whether the property is necessary for the Project; (4) whether either the offer required by Section 7267.2 of the Government Code has been made to the owner, or the offer has not been made because the owner cannot be located with reasonable diligence; and (5) whether the offer required by Section 7267.2 of the Government Code was made in the form and substance required by law.

After the City receives testimony and evidence from all interested parties, the City Council must make a determination as to whether to acquire the Property via eminent domain and, if chooses to do so, adopt the proposed Resolution of Necessity (Attachment B). In adopting the Resolution of Necessity, the City must find and determine that, based upon evidence of the above stated conditions, acquisition by eminent domain is necessary. Approval of the Resolution of Necessity requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds vote of all the members of the City Council.

Evidence in Support of Findings

The following evidence is provided in support of the required findings:

1. The roundabout component affects the Property located at 148 East Nebraska Avenue which is currently a residential home.
2. Written offer to purchase the Property (Attachment A) was made to the property owners on July 24, 2019. The offer was accompanied by a copy of an appraisal of the fair market value of the Property obtained by the City from an independent appraiser. The property has title issues regarding ownership and the City could not locate one of the interested parties. An acquisition through negotiation was not able to be obtained.
3. Notice of this hearing was given to the owner of the Property in writing (English and Spanish) as required by law on April 8, 2020.

The right of way is required and necessary for the construction of public road improvements. In the absence of a negotiated agreement with the owner of the Property, it is necessary to initiate the eminent domain process in order to protect the grant funding and project schedule.

FISCAL IMPACT

The budget for the Alta and Nebraska Avenue Roundabout Project includes funds for easement acquisition. The acquisition of the easements will be funded with Measure R and CMAQ funds which was approved as part of Resolution No 2018-05.

PUBLIC HEARING

The Notice of Intent, in English and Spanish, was delivered to the property owners on April 8, 2020 which is required by law.

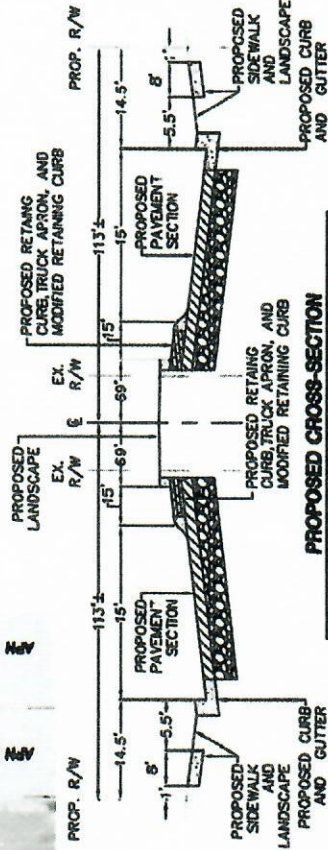
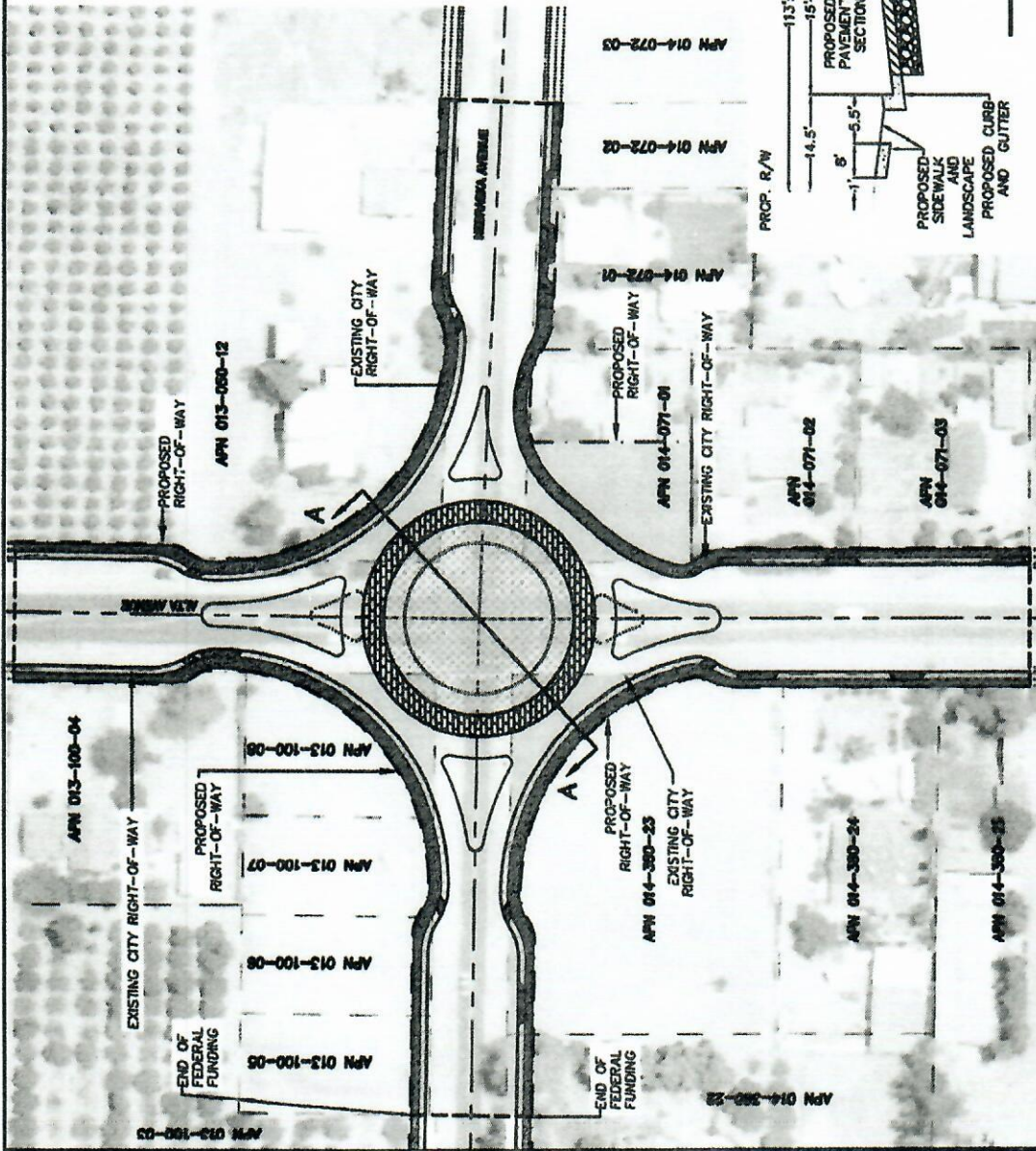

This brochure is designed to inform you
of the requirements of Title VI of
the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and your
rights under those requirements.

WHAT IS TITLE VI?

Title VI is a statute provision of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

Title VI (Sec. 601) of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 provides:

"No person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance." (42 U.S.C. Sec 2000d)

Additionally, Executive Order 12898, Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations, 1994 provides:

"Each Federal agency shall make achieving environmental justice part of its mission by identifying and addressing, as appropriate, disproportionately high and adverse human health or environmental effects of its programs, policies, and activities on minority populations and low-income populations."

Related statutes provide protection against discrimination on the basis of sex, age or disability by programs receiving Federal financial assistance.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

That Caltrans strives to ensure that access to and use of all programs, services or benefits derived from any Caltrans activity will be administered without regard to race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability or socioeconomic status.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DINUBA THAT RESOLUTION OF NECESSITY REQUIRING THE EXERCISE OF THE POWER OF EMINENT DOMAIN PERTAINING TO THE ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY FOR USE BY THE CITY OF DINUBA FOR THE ALTA AND NEBRASKA AVENUES ROUNDABOUT PROJECT IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 1240.030 OF THE CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, the City of Dinuba intends to construct a project entitled the Alta & Nebraska Avenues Roundabout Project, which involves the construction of a roundabout; and

WHEREAS, after notice and opportunity have been given to the property owner(s) at issue, the City Council of the City of Dinuba hereby finds and determines as follows:

1. The City of Dinuba intends to construct the aforementioned Project, a public use, together with related improvements to carry out and make effective the principal purpose pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure Section 1240.120(a), and in connection therewith, acquire interest in certain real property. Said public use is a function of the City of Dinuba.
2. The City of Dinuba is authorized to acquire the portion of the parcel described in Appendix A herein and exercise the power of eminent domain for the public use set forth herein in accordance with the California Constitution and the California Eminent Domain Law, Code of Civil Procedure Section 1230.010 et seq. and pursuant to Government Code Section 37350.5, Government Code Section 54300 et seq., California Constitution, Article I, Section 1.01 and Article II, Section 2.03 of the Charter of the City of Dinuba.
3. The property to be acquired consists of a portion of the property (APN 014-071-001) sitting on the north side of said property. The area consists of 7,079 square feet. The property sits at the southeast corner of Nebraska Avenue and Alta Avenue. This subject property will be utilized for a roundabout to improve public safety and traffic flow. The property to be acquired is more particularly described in Appendix A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference together with a map thereof.
4. On April 8, 2020, there was a mailed Notice of Hearing on the intent of the City of Dinuba to adopt a Resolution of Necessity for acquisition by eminent domain of the real property described in Appendix A herein, which Notice of Hearing is attached hereto as Appendix B and is incorporated herein by this reference. Said Notice of Hearing was mailed to all persons whose names appear on the last equalized County Assessment Roll as having an interest in the property described in Appendix A, and to the address appearing on said Roll. Said Notice advised said persons of their right to be heard on the matters referred to therein on the date and at the time and place stated therein.
5. The hearing set out in said Notice was held on April 28, 2020, at the time and place stated therein, and all interested parties were given an opportunity to be

heard. The hearing was then closed.

Based upon the evidence presented, this City Council, by vote of two-thirds or more of its members, further finds, determines, declares, and resolves each of the following:

- a. The public interest and necessity require the proposed project.
 - b. The proposed project is planned or located in the manner that will be most compatible with the greatest public good and the least private injury.
 - c. The property described herein in Appendix A is necessary for the proposed project.
 - d. The offer required by Section 7267.2 of the Government Code, and the summary of the basis for the amount established as just compensation, was made to the owner or owners of record.
 - e. All conditions and statutory requirements necessary to exercise the power of eminent domain (the right to take) to acquire the property described herein have been complied with by the City of Dinuba.
 - f. A portion of the property described in Appendix A may be acquired for a more necessary public use pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure Section 1240.610. The City Council further finds and determines that insofar as said parcel has heretofore been dedicated to the public for public street and utility purposes, the acquisition and use of said parcel by the City of Dinuba for the public use described above is for a more necessary public use than the use to which the property has already been appropriated.
6. The City Attorney is hereby AUTHORIZED and EMPOWERED:
- a. To acquire in the name of the City of Dinuba, by condemnation, the property described in Appendix A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference in accordance with the provisions of the California Eminent Domain Law and the Constitution of California;
 - b. To acquire the property in fee simple unless a lesser estate is described in Appendix A, herein;
 - c. To prepare or have prepared and to prosecute or to retain counsel to prosecute in the name of the City of Dinuba such proceedings in the proper court as are necessary for such acquisition;
 - d. To deposit the probable amount of compensation, based on an appraisal, and to apply to said court for an order permitting the City of Dinuba to take immediate possession and use of said property for said public uses and purposes.

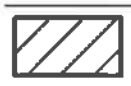

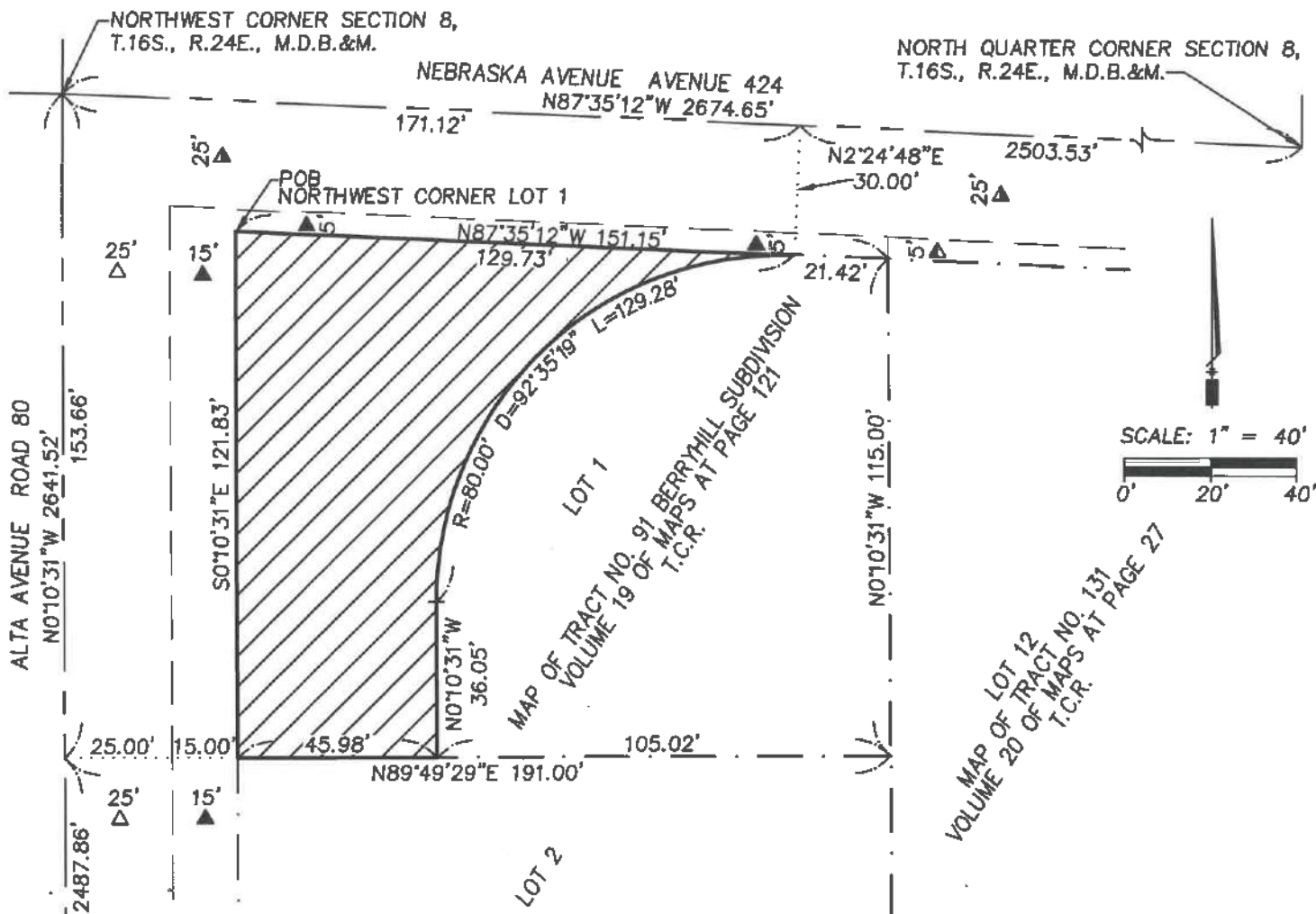

RECOMMENDATION

Council to receive informational update regarding Covid-19 pandemic and provide direction to staff as necessary.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The state of Californian is now in its fifth week of the Governor's stay-at-home order. Although positive cases continue to be reported across the state, the Governor recently outlined six critical indicators the state will consider for gradually modifying the stay-at-home orders. The Governor is working across various state and local agencies to make progress on these indicators in hopes of gradually easing his stay-at-home order. However, the Governor did not provide a definitive timeline for reopening parts of the economy.

OUTSTANDING ISSUES

None.

DISCUSSION

Federal Level

On April 16, 2020, the President provided Governors with a three-phased plan to reopen economy. A copy of the President's plan is enclosed as Attachment 'A'. The President is leaving it up to each state to determine how and when to implement the phased-approach. However, many governors in hard-hit states will continue to evaluate their respective situation and make their own decision as to when and how to reopen their respective economies.

Last week, Congress passed and the President signed a third stimulus package totaling \$484 billion in new aid for small businesses and hospitals and more funding for testing. With more than 26 million American's filing for unemployment, the government is attempting to ease the burden by providing additional stimulus to the economy. Although no funding was included for cities to help address the revenue shortfalls and increase in expenses due to COVID-19, the President and the Speaker publicly committed to provide such aid in the next round of Covid-19 stimulus package. No timing has been provided on when this might occur.

State Level

On April 14, 2020, the Governor outlined six key indicators that will be used to determine how and when the state will modify the stay-at-home order. The six indicators are:

1. The ability to monitor and protect our communities through testing, contact tracing, isolating, and supporting those who are positive or exposed.
2. The ability to prevent infection in people who are at risk for more severe COVID-1.
3. The ability of the hospital and health systems to handle surge.
4. The ability to develop therapeutics to meet the demand.
5. The ability for businesses, schools, and child care facilities to support physical distancing.
6. The ability to determine when to reinstitute certain measures, such as the stay-at-home orders, if necessary.

The Governor has yet to announce a definitive timeline for when parts of the economy may be allowed to reopen. However, the state has taken the following actions towards meeting the six indicators: allowing hospitals and health systems to resume delayed medical care for Californians, add at least an additional 80 testing sites around the state and train up to 10,000 contract tracers to track individuals possibly exposed to the virus. The Governor hopes that these and other measures will allow for the state to gradually modify the stay-at-home orders in the coming weeks.

More than 3.4 million California's have applied for unemployment benefits since March 2015. The financial impacts of the stay-at-home order continues to be a growing concern for the state, counties and cities. The California League of Cities has been working with the Governor and the state legislature on funding to help local jurisdictions backfill any loss revenues due to the pandemic.

Local Level

The city continues to closely monitor events related to Covid-19 pandemic. Tulare County continues to experience increases in cases as more testing is done and hot spots are detected. A major spike occurred due to an outbreak in a nursing home in Visalia and in Lindsay. Fortunately, city employees are doing a great job practicing safe distancing, personal hygiene and use of personal protective equipment as no employee have tested positive for the coronavirus.

As we evaluate the fiscal year end 2019-2020 and prepare for the next fiscal year 2020-2021, there is much uncertainty regarding the fiscal impact on the city's revenues. We are working closely with our sales tax consultant on projecting impacts on sales tax and other revenues resulting from the Covid-19 pandemic. Although we expect a drop in revenue in the second and third quarter of this year, we may not have a good handle on the impacts until late May or early June.

We expect more information on the gradual opening of parts of the economy later this month or in early May. Our collective hope is that the number of positive cases and related deaths flatten or decrease in the weeks ahead. Staff will continue to closely monitor county, state and federal actions related to Covid-19 and provide updates to the City Council and the community as information is received.

FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impacts on the city's revenues relate to Covid-19 pandemic is unknown. Staff is working with its sales tax consultant to provide some projections for fiscal year-end 2019-2020 and for fiscal year 2020-21.

(Satisfy Before Proceeding to Phased Opening)

SYMPTOMS

Downward trajectory of influenza-like illnesses (ILI) reported within a 14-day period

AND

Downward trajectory of covid-like syndromic cases reported within a 14-day period

CASES

Downward trajectory of documented cases within a 14-day period

OR

Downward trajectory of positive tests as a percent of total tests within a 14-day period (flat or increasing volume of tests)

HOSPITALS

Treat all patients without crisis care

AND

Robust testing program in place for at-risk healthcare workers, including emerging antibody testing

*State and local officials may need to tailor the application of these criteria to local circumstances (e.g., metropolitan areas that have suffered severe COVID outbreaks, rural and suburban areas where outbreaks have not occurred or have been mild). Additionally, where appropriate, Governors should work on a regional basis to satisfy these criteria and to progress through the phases outlined below.
